Self-Checklist for Authors regarding Strict Adherence for submitting the papers

1. Author names should not include salutations (Dr., Prof., etc.) or middle names, in accordance with publisher guidelines.

First Author¹ , Second Author²

¹ Affiliation of first author

² Affiliation of second author

2. If multiple authors share the same affiliation, it should be listed only once.
3. The abstract should be 200 – 250 words, with 6 – 8 relevant keywords.
4. **The paper must be of min 10 pages and strictly follow the Springer Nature Single Column formatting guidelines (margins, font, line spacing, etc.) and include the following sections:**
 - Strong Introduction (including objectives and contributions)
 - Literature Review
 - Materials and Methodology
 - Proposed Model / Experimental Results / Discussion
 - Conclusion and Future Scope

Do not increase page count by disproportionately enlarging figures, tables, or by adding unnecessary white spaces.

5. All tables and figures must be properly numbered as per Springer Nature formatting and **cited in the manuscript text**. The Captions(Number and Label/title) for the table should be above the table and for the figure should be below the figure and must be of size 9-point
6. Figure/graphs/ diagrams should be of high resolution with minimum 300dpi.
7. Displayed equations or formulae must be centered and set on a separate line. Equations should be **numbered for reference and cited in the manuscript**.
8. Arabic numbers: 1, 2, 3,... are used for citation, which is sequential by order of citation of the references. The citation numbers are given in square brackets and are not superscripted. Please observe the following guidelines: Single citation: [9] , Multiple citation: [4-6, 9].
9. References should be in APA style.
10. References mentioned in the reference section should follow the order of citation in the body of the paper. The paper must include adequate, relevant, and recent references.

11. AI authorship:

Large Language Models (LLMs), such as ChatGPT, do not currently satisfy our authorship criteria. Notably an attribution of authorship carries with its accountability for the work, which cannot be effectively applied to LLMs. Use of an LLM should be properly documented in the Methods section (and if a Methods section is not available, in a suitable alternative part) of the manuscript. The use of an LLM (or other AI-tool) for “AI assisted copy editing” purposes does not need to be declared.

In this context, we define the term "AI assisted copy editing" as AI-assisted improvements to human-generated texts for readability and style, and to ensure that the texts are free of errors in grammar, spelling, punctuation and tone. These AI-assisted improvements may include wording and formatting changes to the texts, but do not include generative editorial work and autonomous content creation. In all cases, there must be human accountability for the final version of the text and agreement from the authors that the edits reflect their original work.

Generative AI images

The fast-moving area of generative AI image creation has resulted in novel legal copyright and research integrity issues. As publishers, we strictly follow existing copyright law and best practices regarding publication ethics. While legal issues relating to AI-generated images and videos remain broadly unresolved, Springer Nature journals are unable to permit its use for publication.

It is mandatory for authors to submit the following with final submission

- i. Final Paper Submission in word format.
- ii. Final Paper Submission in pdf format.
- iii. **Similarity Report** (Turnitin or iThenticate) of the final version
- iv. **AI Detection Report** (Turnitin or iThenticate) of the final version
- v. **Consent for publication** (Will be shared by the organizers as and when received by the publisher)

Note: Coordinators, Technical Programme Committee and Conference Organisers will not shoulder the responsibility of those authors and their submissions who fail to comply (for any reason) with the above mentioned 12 points, and do not submit the revised papers in time as per the guidelines.
